Position: Home Visitor

Reporting to: ParentChild+ Coordinator

Purpose of Position: To deliver the ParentChild+ Programme to children and their families.

Employment conditions:

Key Responsibilities:

- Deliver the ParentChild+ programme to children and their families through twice weekly home visits including indoor/outdoor visits and video calls and/or through other suitable formats.
- Attend and participate in weekly supervision session
- Take part in home visitor training, both accredited and non-accredited
- Organise and deliver events for the programme families
- Prepare and maintain records, reports and/or test data on the programme and participating families
- Participate in research activities
- Any other duties as assigned by the ParentChild+ Coordinator.

Skills and Experience required:

- Relevant experience of working with young children and families (essential)
- Relevant qualifications in Early Years' Education and Care (with QQI Level 5 ECCE qualification or equivalent) (Desirable).
- Ability to operate as a team player in a cross disciplinary, integrated team, sharing roles and responsibilities
- An energetic, confident and pro-active individual with strong interpersonal and communication skills
- Good time management, administrative and organisational skills and be willing to learn basic technical skills to deliver the programme online
